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What is Drama?

Drama is not only an art form but a form to learn and experience new things. It allows you to explore your own limits and push these limits farther emotionally, physically, intellectually, aesthetically, and socially. It allows you to work with others and become more comfortable and confident with group interaction. It is about exploring who you are and becoming comfortable with exploring and taking risks with those around you.

Goals of Drama 10

Goal 1: To acquire knowledge of self and others through participation in and reflection on dramatic experience.

Goal 2: To develop competency in communication skills through participation in and exploration of various Dramatic Disciplines.

Goal 3: To develop an appreciation for drama and theatre as a process and art form.

Dramatic Disciplines and Units

Orientation and Movement – The Collective

Students will develop skills in movement and scene composition by working together as a class and in small groups to create a collective creation. Throughout this creation we will work through creating awareness within ourselves and with others. The final piece will be performed in the Media Centre.

Improvisation and Speech – Halloween Character

Students will work on creating improvised scenes with a focus on character. They will then create characters and mini scenes that will be part of the Haunted House put on by the Grade 9 and 10 Drama Class and Technical Theater Class.

Speech – *Reader's Theatre*

Students will first explore the voice, the parts of the voice, and how to warm it up properly. They will then be put into groups and given a piece of Reader's Theatre to be rehearsed. These polished works will then be performed for the class.

Improvisation, Speech and Movement – Character Creations

Students will examine movement closer with character and create their own character based on various movement and improv. exercises. These character will then be used to create long form improvised scenes using the. The scenes will be performed for the class in the Media Centre.

Theatre Studies – Theatre Evolution

Students will explore how theatre has evolved looking at Greek Theatre, Medieval and Elizabethan Theatre, and Canadian Theatre. They will then create a graphic organizer to show how theatre has evolved over the years.

Theatre Studies – *Development of Theatre*

Students will analyze a variety of scripts varying in time periods. Students will then be asked to choose a time period and write a paper discussing how this period has impacted theatre today. They will then choose to work in small groups or alone to prepare a scene or monologue as their final project for the class. These will be performed in the Media Centre.

Final Project

The Final Project will encompass the disciplines focused on during the semester. The project will depend on the students in the class and their area(s) of interest. The final project may or may not be public performance. Further discussion about the project will occur during the last part of the semester.

Digital Journal

Reflection is very important to the dramatic process. Students will be asked to keep up with a digital journal used as terms of reflection for the student's experiences and discoveries during class.
